I have just completed the third of four treatments of the second round of passive immune therapy. This round of treatments is going well with little “after effects” with the exception of the typical fatigue. I will do one more treatment next Wednesday and hopefully that is it! I met with the doctor today and I was given a good prognosis. All my blood work came out excellently also. In fact, every system tested out normal – even my glucose levels – so that is awesome!
